COUNCIL'S NEW FACES

The face of Overstrand Municipality's Council changed considerably with no fewer than five changes since the National and Provincial elections in April last year.

Considering the fact that Council only consists of 19 members, the recent changes represent a 26 per cent staff turnover. Luckily it had little effect on the way the Municipality is managed and throughout the focus could remain on service delivery to the community.

These types of changes are not uncommon. During the previous five year term there were three changes in councillors and after a floor crossing there was even a change in the ruling party.

The most recent addition is Councillor Jacob Prins who won a tightly contested by-election in Ward 1 (Gansbaai, Masakhane and Blompark) on 24 February for the DA. The day thereafter he was already roped in for his first council meeting.

Ward 1 was previously the seat of the late Councillor Violet Tutu (NPP) who was relieved of her position on 31 December 2009 for many meetings she could not attend nor tender apologies due to her health problems.

The new councillor is a well known resident of Blompark where he is involved in the AFM congregation as a lay

preacher. Prins studied theology at the Sarepta Theological College with community development as one of his major subjects. He is continuing his studies by working towards a B.Ed degree. He serves on the governing body of Gansbaai Academia, the new high school there. Prins is married to Delia and they have three children.

In January Andrew Sithembele Komani of the National Peoples' Party (NPP) was declared elected as councillor to the Overstrand Municipality by the Independent Electoral Commission. He replaced Cllr Moira Opperman, who ceased to hold office as a proportional representative in the Overstrand Council, when she was suspended by the NPP. The 35 year old Komani is resident in Masakhane, Gansbaai. He had to relinquish his position as an employee of Overstrand Municipality to take up his new role. Cllr Komani is married. His home language is

Xhosa, but he can also converse in Afrikaans and English. He finished his schooling at the Nosizwe High School in 1993.

The other newcomers are Councillor Phillipus May (ANC) who was appointed as proportional member in the place of alderman Willie Smuts, Councillor Rudolf Smith (DA) who replaced alderman Verrell Herbart and Councillor Allan Berry (DA) who won the by-election in Ward 3 (Stanford and Voëlkop) in June 2009 when Councillor Mike Walters vacated the seat to take service in the Western Cape Legislature.

We wish these councillors all of the best with their challenging task to make Overstrand Municipality a centre of excellence for our communities.

Former councillor Nomatshayina Violet Tutu passed away on Friday 26 February 2010 after having been in poor health for some time. Nomatshayina was elected ANC councillor for Ward 1 in the 2006 municipal elections. She had come to the fore as a community leader in 2003 when she became a member of the Social Compact of the Gansbaai Housing Project, representing Masakhane. She was also a lay preacher. In September 2008 she crossed the floor to join the National People's Party. She served until 31 December 2009 when her services were terminated by the MEC for Local Government after she had missed several council and portfolio committee meetings without tendering apologies. Violet was laid to rest in East London on Saturday 20 March 2010. May her soul rest in peace.

WELL-TRAINED PERSONNEL NEEDED

It is quite a common sight these days to see Fire Brigade personnel being trained. Phambili asked Disaster Management Co-ordinator, Marlu Rust, what is going on. This was Marlu's answer:

"We are planning many more courses for our members. Overstrand is unique and for that reason our fire services must be highly trained. We have to look at our topography. We need to train our members in all spheres. We have the sea, mountains, roads and other infrastructure. We have floods and fires, to mention just the two major causes of disaster.

"Our members must be prepared for

all types of rescues. Intensive training started in 2008/ 2009. So far we have conducted training in first aid, rope rescue and the management systems for major incidents.

"We want our members to be well trained and only use accredited training institutions although some of our programmes are run internally, especially with regard to fire fighting.

"We have just completed a Hazmat Awareness course, which started on 15 March 2010 and ended on 23 March 2010 with the final exam at Petrol SA in Mossel Bay. Twelve members attended.

This course is an accredited course and accepted countrywide.

"This course is important because hazardous materials are being transported on our roads. These members were trained to identify the substance or gas being transported and to implement precautionary measures to ensure safety at accidents."

Thank you, Marlu, we found this extremely interesting and are proud of our men and women involved in the Fire Brigade. We hope more of our employees will volunteer their services when there is another opportunity.
