Anton Coetsee, is one of the longest serving brought about a revolution in local government," councillors who has made his mark in local government. Not only has he served as a councillor in various capacities since 1998, but he also recently obtained a Master's degree in Law at the University of Pretoria (UP).

His LLM thesis, entitled An evaluation of the role and functioning of an Appeal Authority created in terms of Section 62 of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act 32 of 2000, was the result of four years of intensive research.

"This Section 62 is of great importance to the community," said Anton, "because it is the cornerstone on which the concept of separation of powers in municipalities is built

"The Systems Act stipulates that the community is part of a municipality. This appeal procedure is the mechanism that can be used by members of the public when someone is dissatisfied with a decision taken by the executive authority and to literally keep a municipality on its toes."

After Anton realised that some municipalities struggle with the application of this appeal procedure, he wanted to write a manual as a tool for 2006 and Nicolette Botha-Guthrie in 2010. municipalities. However, it had to be an authoritative piece that could also be used by lawyers when advising or assisting their clients in this regard.
