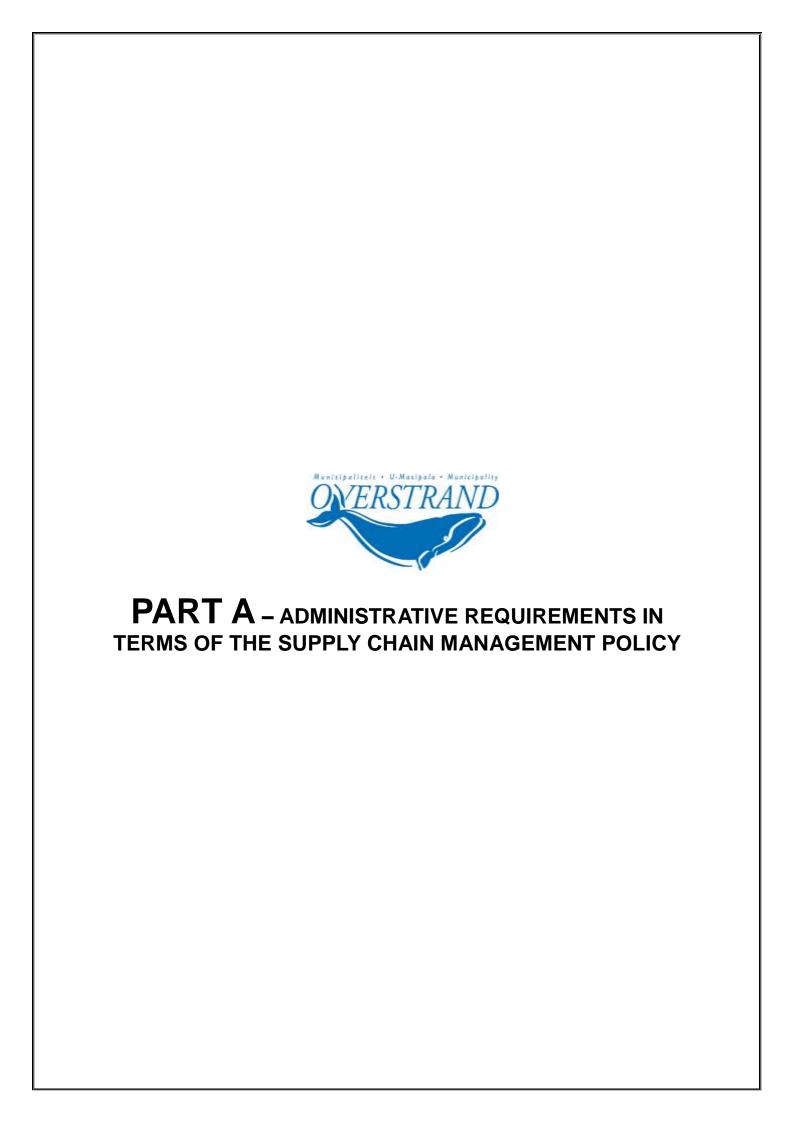

5. GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT – GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENT

1. **DEFINITIONS**

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- 1.1. "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2. "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3. "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4. "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5. "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally
- 1.6. "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7. "Day" means calendar day.
- 1.8. "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9. "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand
- 1.10. "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.11. "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
- 1.12. "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable.
- 1.13. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- 1.14. "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.15. "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.16. "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.17. "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.

- 1.18. "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.19. "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.20. "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.21. "Project site" where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.22. "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.23. "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.24. "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.25. "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- 1.26. "Supplier" means the successful bidder who is awarded the contract to maintain and administer the required and specified service(s) to the State.
- 1.27. "Tort" means in breach of contract.
- 1.28. "Turnkey" means a procurement process where one service provider assumes total responsibility for all aspects of the project and delivers the full end product / service required by the contract.
- 1.29. "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

2. Application

- 2.1. These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.
- 2.2. Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.
- 2.3. Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

3. General

- 3.1. Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2. Invitations to bid are usually published in locally distributed news media and on the municipality / municipal entity website.

4. Standards

4.1. The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

5. Use of contract documents and information; inspection.

- 5.1. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only as far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.

- 5.3. Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4. The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6. Patent rights

- 6.1. The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.
- 6.2. When a supplier developed documentation / projects for the municipality / municipal entity, the intellectual, copy and patent rights or ownership of such documents or projects will vest in the municipality / municipal entity.

7. Performance security

- 7.1. Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.
- 7.2. The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3. The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
 - 7.3.1. bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
 - 7.3.2. a cashier's or certified cheque
- 7.4. The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified.

8. Inspections, tests and analyses

- 8.1. All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2. If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspections tests and analysis, the bidder or contractor's premises shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the purchaser or an organization acting on behalf of the purchaser.
- 8.3. If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4. If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the goods to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5. Where the goods or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such goods or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.
- 8.6. Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.

- 8.7. Any contract goods may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected goods shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with goods which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected goods shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute goods forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected goods, purchase such goods as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.
- 8.8. The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 22 of GCC.

9. Packing

- 9.1. The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- 9.2. The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

10. Delivery

Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the documents and terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified.

11. Insurance

The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified.

12. Transportation

Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified.

13. Incidental

- 13.1. The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any:
 - 13.1.1. performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;

19. Assignment

The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

20. Subcontracts

21. Delays in the supplier's performance

24. Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights

The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. INTRODUCTION

The Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act 85 of 1993) stipulates that the Chief Executive Officer is primarily responsible or liable for the health and safety of all his/her employees. This is embedded in Section 16(1) of the said Act. This responsibility or liability is also extended to include a mandatary that performs work on behalf of the employer on his/her premises.

A "mandatary" is defined in the said Act as: - "Including an agent, contractor or subcontractor for work, but without derogating from his status in his own right as an employer or user"

In terms of Section 37(2), read with Section 41, of the said Act, it is legally possible for an employer to indemnify himself from this responsibility or liability regarding the actions of the mandatary. Section 37(2) stipulates that there should be a written agreement in place between the employer and the mandatary regarding the arrangements and procedures between them to ensure compliance by the mandatary with the provisions of the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993.

By ensuring that there is a written agreement in place, the Management of Overstrand Municipality is acting in a responsible manner, so as to ensure that this requirement is indeed being met.

In order to ensure that this written agreement is honoured at all times, regular inspections of work that is performed will be conducted and if found not complying with the said agreement, a notice of non-compliance will be issued. All work will be stopped and reasons for non-compliance must be given and what corrective action will be taken to rectify the situation must be stipulated.

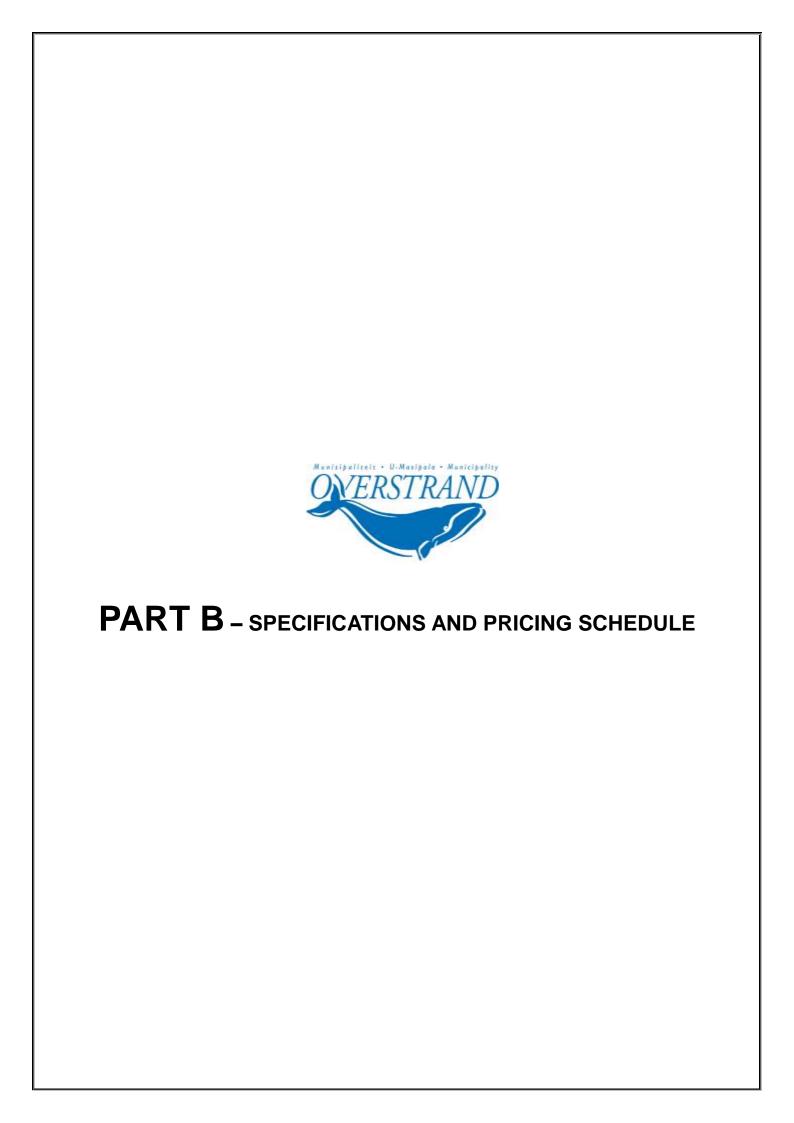

- 7.3. The Contractor shall be COIDA compliant before the execution of any work in terms of this agreement.

8. EQUIPMENT

- 8.1. All vehicles, equipment and tools, as well as consumables required to execute the cleaning and removal operations, as per this specification, shall be provided by the contractor.
- 8.2. Proof of the existence and condition of such vehicles, equipment and tools shall be provided by the Contractor and be made available for scrutiny by the Municipality, prior to acceptance of the bid from the Contractor (see paragraph 16).
- 8.3. Further, such vehicles, equipment and tools shall be inspected by the Municipality before the signing of the Contract, as well as at any time during the term of the Contract.
- 8.4. A **monthly** report of the equipment will be required from the Contractor to be submitted to the dedicated official (housing official) which will be confirmation that equipment is safe and in a usable state.

9. MATERIALS

- 9.1. All cleaning detergents to clean toilets (for example liquid soap, toilet bowl disinfectant like Jeyes fluid) and refuse bags must be provided by the contractor.
- 9.2. Herbicides will be provided by the Municipality as and when required.

10. CLEANING OF AREAS A AND B

10.1. Cleaning of all residential areas (formal and informal):

- 10.1.1. Collection of refuse and all forms of rubble (building materials, loose stones etc.) in the areas of informal as well as formal houses, open spaces and roads, and removal and transportation of such collected materials to dump sites allocated by the Municipality.
- 10.1.2. Cleaning of bins in informal settlements

10.2. Cleaning of public open spaces, play parks and roads

- 10.2.1. Collection of refuse, all forms of rubble, as well as cutting of alien and unwanted vegetation, with machines or by hand, up to boundary fences of erven, within the demarcated areas. Further to remove such collected materials and transport to dump sites allocated by the Municipality.
- 10.2.2. Sweeping of surfaced roads and sidewalks
- 10.2.3. Cutting of unwanted vegetation, with machines or by hand, on sidewalks and removal of such materials and transported to dump sites allocated by the Municipality.
- 10.2.4. It is expected of the successful contractor(s) to report illegal dumping to the Municipality's help desk in order to keep areas clean.

10.3. Cleaning of open storm-water channels and kerbs, catch pits and manholes

- 10.3.1. Removal of refuse, loose stones and any other obstacles that may affect the flow of water in the storm water drainage system.
- 10.3.2. Spraying growth in trenches with herbicides and removal of dead plant matter, rubble and silt.
- 10.3.3. The use of chemicals, herbicides or any other poisonous product is expressly prohibited without consultation with the relevant environmental section of the municipality.

PLEASE NOTE: This does not include the cleaning of closed-off storm-water systems pipes, culverts and removal of dead plant matter.

10.4. Cleaning of Ablution Facilities

- 10.4.1. The successful tenderer must appoint dedicated personnel (a minimum of two) for the ablution facilities in the Informal Settlement who must be available at the toilet blocks, from 07H45 until 16H30, 5 days a week (Monday to Friday).
- 10.4.2. The toilets must be inspected on a daily basis during the week (Monday to Friday) by the Contractor who shall report on maintenance problems and on an hourly basis on public holidays and weekends by the Contractor who shall report on maintenance problems.
- 10.4.3. The toilets will be inspected on a weekly basis by an Overstrand municipal Official.
- 10.4.4. The inspector's decision on the cleanliness of the facilities will be final and binding.

- 10.4.5. If the site is not cleaned to the inspector's satisfaction, a week's payment will be deducted.
- 10.4.6. Overstrand Municipality will determine a minimum manpower level per toilet block (as per pricing schedules on pages 53 and 54).

10.5. Description of Work

- 10.5.1. Floors and walls in and around toilets must be hosed and cleaned on a daily basis.
- 10.5.2. Toilet bowls must be cleaned (brushed).
- 10.5.3. Wash basins must be cleaned (brushed).
- 10.5.4. Broken and defective toilets must be reported daily at the following telephone number: 028-271 8435.
- 10.5.5. Blocked wash basins and sewerage blockages must be reported daily at the following telephone number: 028-271 8423.
- 10.5.6. Cleaning materials: disinfectant, brooms, black bags, etc. for points a, b and c above, will be for the account of the successful tenderer.
- 10.5.7. An area with a radius of **2 metres** around the toilets is to be cleaned daily. This includes picking up plastic, bottles, paper, glass, etc.
- 10.5.8. Refuse is to be collected into black bags (to be supplied by the contractor) and transported along with the rest of the rubble collected by the contractor, to the local transfer station.

11. TRANSPORT OF REFUSE ALL AREAS

- 11.1. The Contractor shall transport all collected refuse, loose stones and rubble on appropriate vehicles to the local transfer station.
- 11.2. The dumping of collected materials by the Contractor at the local transfer station will be allowed free of charge.

12. REPORTING OF PROBLEMS

- 12.1. The Contractor shall list all required maintenance issues with regard to signage, potholes, and storm water and sewer blockages.
- 12.2. Such list of problems must, on a daily basis, be reported to the helpdesk at the office of the Municipality.
- 12.3. The Contractor shall report all illegal dumping of refuse or rubble in the area of employment. Such reports shall immediately been forwarded to the help desk of the Municipality.

16. INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED

- 16.1. Prospective tenderers **must** submit the following with the tender, in order for the tender to be evaluated.
- 16.2. The bidder shall submit proof that he owns an appropriate, roadworthy vehicle to transport materials, or at least have a rental agreement in place with an entity that has such, required vehicle, and is willing to rent such vehicle to the bidder.
- 16.3. In both the above instances the following proof applies: Registration papers, last date of roadworthy certification, type of vehicle and its condition as well as proof of a valid license. An annual roadworthy certificate must be submitted.
- 16.4. The bidder must submit proof of residence within the designated cleaning area. Such proof shall be in the form of either one of the following:
 - 16.4.1. Municipal account in the name of the bidder; or
 - 16.4.2. Lease agreement with the bidder as the lessee; or
 - 16.4.3. Sworn affidavit in the case of an informal settlement resident.
- 16.5. **The pricing schedule must be duly completed** –**no** open spaces may be left on the document. If a certain item is included in another item or will be provided free of charge, it must be indicated as such in the space provided.
- 16.6. The bidder must provide a list of names and addresses of prospective employees to be employed by him/her as well as copies of their Identity documents. These prospective employees must be residing in the designated area and may not be employed elsewhere for the duration of the contract.

17. PAYMENT

- 17.1. Payment terms following new classifications:
 - 17.1.1. It is the policy of the Overstrand Municipality to pay all creditors by means of direct bank transfers, The norm is that creditors are paid after 30 days, in order to qualify for a weekly payment, a supplier must be classified as a Survivalist enterprise / Micro-enterprises on the Municipality's supplier database. A weekly payment is not a right in terms of this policy. Survivalist enterprises / Micro-enterprises may request such payments which may be made at the discretion of the Municipality and may terminate after 12 months, as it is expected that the enterprise will be self-sustainable thereafter. It is the obligation of the supplier to arrange earlier payments with the creditors department (Mireille Lewis 028 313 8024).
 - 17.1.2. To ensure clear understanding of the abovementioned terms, the following definitions are included:
 - 17.1.2.1. **Survivalist enterprises** are generally defined as businesses set up by people unable to find a paid job or get into an economic sector of their choice. Income generated from these activities usually falls far short of even a minimum income standard, with little capital invested, virtually no skills training in the particular field and only limited opportunities for growth into a viable business. This category is characterized by poverty and the attempt to survive.
 - 17.1.2.2. **Micro-enterprises** are very small businesses, often involving only the owner, some family members and at the most one or two paid employees. They usually lack 'formality' in terms of business licenses, value-added tax (VAT) registration, formal business premises, operating permits and accounting procedures. Most of them have a limited capital base and only rudimentary

technical or business skills among their operators. However, many microenterprises advance into viable small businesses. Earning levels of microenterprises differ widely, depending on the particular sector, the growth phase of the business and access to relevant support.

- 17.2. The successful contractor shall invoice the Municipality on a two (2) weekly (fortnightly) basis. Payment will be made no later than 7 days after submission of invoice subject to the invoice being duly authorized and submitted to the expenditure section on a Friday.
- 17.3. Payment is based on the level of cleanliness/tidiness of the agreed area of work, which level is, subject to clause 1 (b), in the sole discretion of the Municipality.
- 17.4. The housing official shall make a recommendation to the Area Manager regarding the amount due to the Contractor.
- 17.5. The maximum weekly payment shall be in accordance with the total weekly amount set out in the pricing schedule submitted by the bidder.
- 17.6. The level of cleanliness shall be determined by the designated official (housing official) of the Municipality, the housing official shall be responsible for weekly inspections of the area, in consultation with the Area Manager.
- 17.7. After delivery of each invoice, the Contractor shall provide the Municipality with a detailed plan of its activities for the next two weeks.
- 17.8. A works program must be submitted every 2 weeks by the contractor to the Housing Official.
- 17.9. The Contractor shall submit a completed checklist (example attached), on a weekly basis, of activities and operations of the preceding period.

18. ESCALATION

Escalation of 6% will be applied to all tendered rates on 1 July of every year from 1 July 2015 for the duration of the contract.

19. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT.

- 19.1. The Municipality may terminate the contract at its own discretion, with immediate effect with regard to continuous poor performance (in other words below 100%) and / or for non-performance or for any reason that renders the Contractor unable to fulfil its obligations.
- 19.2. The CONTRACTOR may terminate the agreement with one (1) months written notice to the representative of the Municipality understanding that in this event, the Municipality reserves the right to appoint any other Contractor to supply the contemplated services and to claim any losses, damages or costs, of whatever nature, incurred by the Municipality due to this event.

20. CONTRACT PERIOD.

This contract period is three (3) years from the date of appointment until 30 June 2017, unless terminated in terms of paragraph 18 of this contract.

21. TENDER VALIDITY

Tenders must be valid for 60 days after closing date of tender.

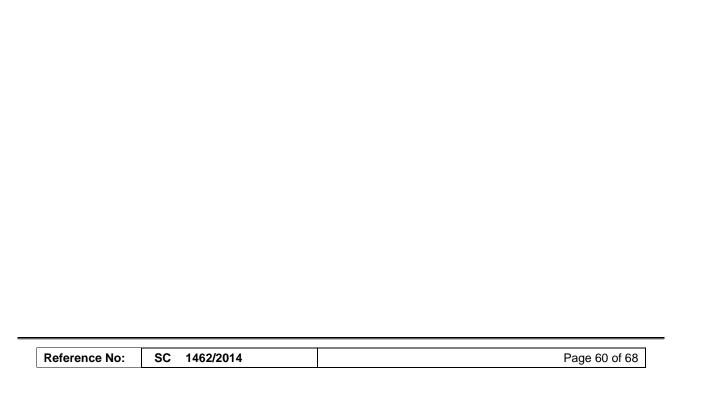
